If you checked yes on any of these questions, then the transgender movement would say you are discriminating against transgender people. Is this actually discrimination? Are any of these "yes" responses ethically/morally wrong?

There is a conflict of rights between women and the transgender movement. Laws protecting "gender identity" reduce women's protections from oppression based in sex (male domination of females). The transgender movement is making claims that unfairly impact everyone else, especially women, girls and lesbians.
